# Speakers:

#### Fr. Maciej (Leszczynski)

Graduated from the Icon Painting school in Bielsk, Warsaw Seminary (Poland), St. Sergius Orthodox Theological Institute (Paris, France). Currently serves as a priest at the St. Alexander Nevsky Cathedral in Paris (France). Founder, director and teacher at the Cathedral's School of Orthodox Icon Painting named after St. Andrei Rublev.

#### Fr. Ioann (Drobot)

Protodeacon of the St. Alexander Nevsky Cathedral in Paris (France). Author of articles on Russian church chants in Russian, French and English. Vice chairman of the Society of Lovers of Church Singing.

#### Fr. Alexandre (Kedrov)

Graduated from St. Sergius Orthodox Theological Institute (Paris, France). In 1991 he was ordained a deacon and appointed as a psalmist at the Cathedral of St. Alexander Nevsky. In 2007 he became the chief choir director of the cathedral. Founder of a male vocal ensemble. In his many years working and giving concerts with the mixed choir of the cathedral, he preserves the musical spirit of the Kedrovs and the choir-singing practice of the Parisian tradition; he also works on the publication of all the works of the Kedrovs.

#### Peter A. Fekula

Member of the Synodal Liturgical Music Commission (ROCOR), coordinator between the Commission and the All-European Church Music Committee. A choir conductor with over forty years experience, and more than three decades of experience organising liturgical music conferences within ROCOR in North America.

#### William Spaulding

Graduate of the University of Maryland and the Vienna Hochschule. In 1997 he was appointed Associate Choirmaster at the Vienna Volksoper, then Principal Choirmaster of the Liceu, Barcelona, and from 2007 to 2016 was Director of the Choir at the Deutsche Oper Berlin, where he was also appointed Kapellmeister in 2012. Since 2016 Director of the Royal Opera Choir and in this role has moderated and presented several Insights events and conducted for the ROH short film Unlocked. Since 2019 he has been Guest Choirmaster of the London Symphony Chorus.

#### Valery V. Kashlyaev

Member of All-European Church Music Committee, Choir Master at the church of St. Panteleymon (Cologne, Germany), choir director of various vocal collectives, one of the organisers of Liturgical Music Conferences in German diocese. A graduate of the Moscow Conservatory in choir conducting and choral disciplines.

#### Matfei K. Malinine

Member of All-European Church Music Committee, teacher of solfege at the Popular Conservatory of Music, Dance and Theater (CPMDT) (Geneva, Switzerland), artistic director of vocal ensemble "Malinine", choir director of various collectives in France and Switzerland, member of professional French and Swiss ensembles.

#### Dr. Svetlana G. Zvereva

Author and editor of scholarly publications, participant and consultant in a number of Russian and international projects related to the research, editing, popularisation, and performance of Russian sacred music, as well as the preservation of Russia's cultural heritage. Senior Research Fellow at the State Institute of Arts Studies (Moscow), Lecturer at the Royal Conservatoir of Scotland (Glasgow, Great Britain). PhD in Art History.

#### Dr. Irina A. du Quenoy

Member of All-European Church Music Committee, member of the Synodal Liturgical Music Commission (ROCOR). Associate Director and instructor of Liturgical Performance Practice at the Synodal School of Liturgical Music (ROCOR). Ph.D. in Political Sciences.

#### Dr. Antonina V. Lebedeva-Emelina

Leading research fellow at the State Institute of Art Studies (Moscow). Has been working at the institute since 1992 in the music history sector. Her research interests include Russian sacred music of the second half of the 18th century (Berezovsky, Bortniansky, Vedel, Degtiarev, etc.) and prerevolutionary Russia (Nikolsky); musical culture of the second half of the 18th century, Mussorgsky's work, source studies and publication of sacred music of the pre-Glinka period.
